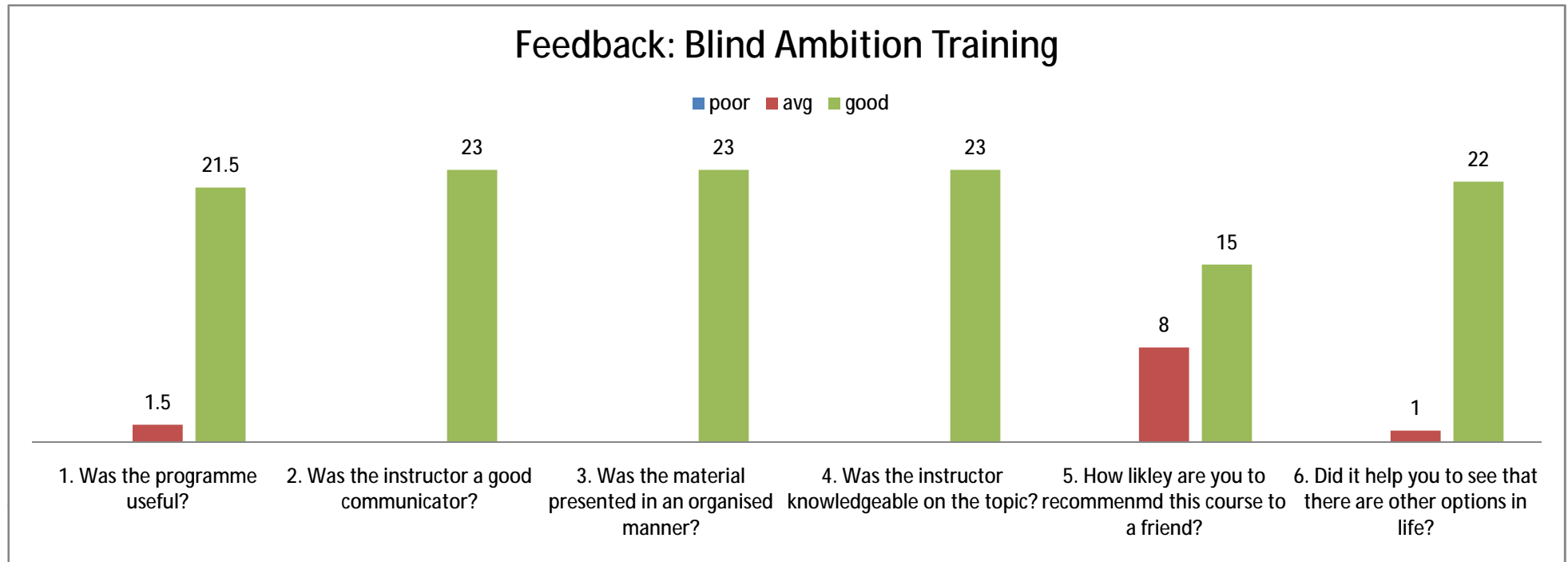
The training went very well. Initially inmates were a little wary and weren't sure they should be seeing a blind person but the feedback indicates they got a lot out of the training. It made them think about other peoples struggles, their own blessings and what they might want to do in future. They were also realising that time is precious, they should use their time in prison well, to learn and educate and be on best behaviour to get out as soon as possible. Additional coaching and careers guidance could support this motivation by setting goals and assessing progress.

95.6% of responders said the training had 'helped them see there are other options in life'. Perhaps the question about whether they would recommend to a friend is the most important question in service delivery , in a prison environment and for a course about social awareness and disability it's amazing that 65% said they would recommend the course. A significant number were also interested in further training.

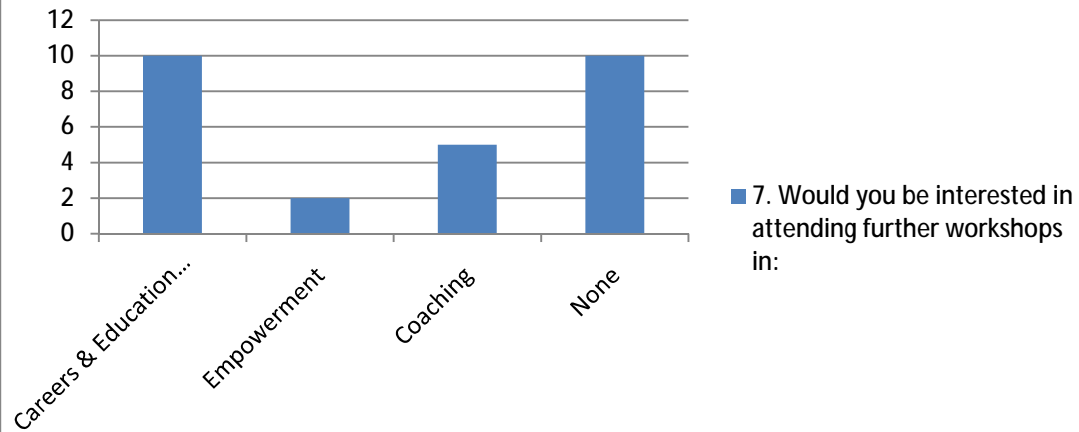
nb. In hindsight we should have tagged responses from the younger group and older group to see if there was a difference in response between ages. The results here put everyone together.

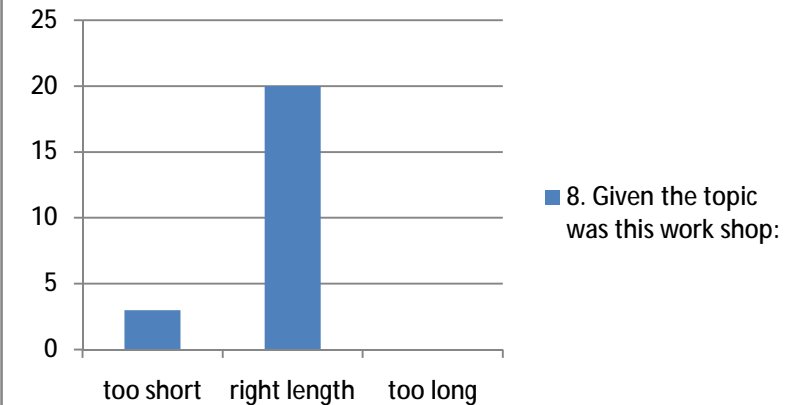
